DO THE MATH

Poor Hillary, The New York Times, The Washington Post, and MSNBC are piling on. The Clintons have trouble telling the truth, and even though they are one of the richest families in the country now, it would be disrespectful to a lot of hard working, moral people in trailer parks to call them "trailer trash."
